James and Oliver Phelps play the Weasley twins, Fred and George, in the Harry Potter films. They must be one of the most famous sets of twins in the world. They were 14 when they were auditioned for the role and they had no acting experience. They seem to have fallen into acting by accident, rather than it being a passion. ' felt like I wasn't a proper actor for about three or four years,' says James. 'I'm very aware that I am lucky to call it my job.'

Though quick to express their gratitude for their parts in the film, they admit that going on set as 'the twins' felt like a step backwards. They had spent the last few years at secondary school carefully carving out their own identities and making their own friends. Now they were known as 'the twins' again, this time on a global scale. For one thing, they had to look the same, something they had always fought against.

Even when it came to casting them, there seems to have been a temptation to see and treat them as one unit. Were James and Oliver very conscious that they were twins as children? Their parents would dress them in different clothes, mainly to tell them apart but also because the family were involved in TMB Association (Twins and Multiple Birth Association), which has always encouraged children's individuality.
