McDonald's Taken to Court

In 2002, several obese teenagers in the USA sued claiming that the company was responsible for making them fat. **A.** _____ They claimed that the company had not warned them about the health problems that can result from eating too much salty, high-fat food and drinking too many sugary drinks: diabetes, high blood pressure and obesity. The mother of one of the children, who at the age of 15 weighed more than 180 kg, said in her statement: 'I always believed McDonald's was healthy for my son.'

McDonald's rejected the claim that they were responsible for these teenagers' health problems. **B.**______ 'The understanding of what hamburgers and French fries do has been with us for a long, long time' he added. The judge agreed, and dismissed the case, saying: 'it is not the place of the law to protect people against their own excesses.'

C. <u>In 2005</u>, the US House of Representatives passed a bill which became known as the 'Cheeseburger Bill.' It made it much harder for obese people to take legal action against the food industry.
